Those Affected Include: All Providers and Clinical Staff, Excluding Departments Using the Beacon/IP MAR

### Ambulatory Medication Administration Record (MAR)

The Ambulatory Medication Administration Record, or Ambulatory MAR, allows staff, and providers who administer medications, to document easily and quickly the back office medication administration in a compliant manner that captures all the medication data required for billing and reporting.

- We will add a new Clinic Administered Medications (CAM) preference list to all AMB departments. Nearly all Back Office (BO) meds will now have corresponding CAM meds. For those that do not, the BO med will remain. When searching medications, CAM medications will appear with all others.


# Update to KPHC [v2017]

- You will need to convert previously signed Back Office medication orders to CAM orders after the August 26, 2017 Update to KP HealthConnect. You can do this in one of two ways:
  - The Provider discontinues the current BO medication order and places a new CAM order for the remaining administrations.
  - Licensed nursing staff transcribes the previously signed BO medication order to a CAM order and establishes the frequency and remaining doses to be aligned with the current order. Licensed nursing staff will then need to inform the ordering provider to discontinue the current BO order. Licensed nursing staff should obtain any missing information from the ordering provider and/or doctor of the day.
- You can convert a previously signed BO medication to a CAM medication at the time the Administration is due or during any time prior to the due date.
- We will remove BO medications that have new CAM medications from your personal preference lists. You will need to recreate these, if necessary, using the new CAM medications.
  - Prior to the upgrade you may wish to take note of your personal preference list BO medications and any order details you want to recreate with new CAM medications.
- We added a **Meds Due** column within each department's Multiple Provider Schedule (MPS) that will alert the staff of patients who have a medication due for administration.
  - Use Meds Due item number [33132] to display **Meds Due** in your customized MPS.

- The change will include use of an Ambulatory Medication Administration Record (MAR) to perform medication administration documentation. This replaces "med note" documentation.
  - Click the blue Due bar to open the MAR documentation detail.
