Standard Surgical Masks	 Standard Ear-loop or Surgical Masks: Ensure patients with acute respiratory illness are separated from other patients in waiting areas and are offered surgical masks, tissues, and hand hygiene degermer All patient care staff should follow Droplet Precaution protective measures (surgical mask, eye protection, gown, and gloves) when coming within 3 feet of a patient with respiratory illness 		 Environmental Cleaning: Disinfect Surfaces – Wipe equipment and surfaces frequently with Asepti wipes to prevent contamination with respiratory secretions Use hospital approved disinfectant for routine cleaning, pay attention to high touch surfaces Refer to EVS/IC policy
